

## GPWU's Response to raising the Gunma alert level to stage 3

Gunma Prefecture will raise coronavirus alert level to stage 3 from 2<sup>nd</sup> August.

The Gunma government deem it necessary to raise higher level depend on the future situation.

GPWU has some students who has been infected with COVID-19. Full vaccination has been recommended.

1 The alert level pursuant to GPWU Activity Restrictions Index for the Prevention of the Spread of COVID-19 will be specified at Level 3 from 2<sup>nd</sup> August.

1	Classes and Exams	In-person classes and exams may be held.
2	Meetings, etc	All meetings shall be held online as a general rule. In-person meetings are acceptable if a chairman requests.
3	Research activities	Research at home is encouraged.
4	Access to university premises	A notification is required when the faculty works on campus.
5	Field works	Field works are prohibited as general rule. There are some exceptions depend on the COVID-19 infection status.

※Face shields are requisite for the classes which includes pair or group works at close range during the time.

※If you have a high fever or cold like symptoms, contact the Gunma Prefecture consultation call center as soon as possible.

2 Faculty are asked to continue to make every effort to avoid the “five situations (\*1)” in everyday activities in which the risk of infection is increased, and the “three Cs (\*2)”. Please also continue to strictly follow the basic measures to prevent infection, such as washing your hands frequently, gargling, hands sanitation, wearing masks, and refraining from talking loudly.

Gunma Prefecture states that we all should refrain from unnecessary and unurgent going-out to the areas where the state of emergency or priority measure to prevent the spread of disease

have been issued.

(\*1) The “five situations” in which the risk of infection is increased: gatherings involving the consumption of alcohol; eating or drinking together in large groups or for a long time; conversations without masks; living together in cramped conditions; moving between different surroundings

(\*2) The “three Cs”: closed spaces with poor ventilation, crowded places with many people nearby, close-contact settings such as close-range conversations
